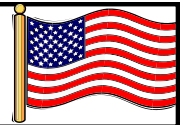

Message from Councilman Matt Ence: Use Fireworks Safely This Year

As patriotic summertime holidays approach, many of us look forward to celebrating with fireworks. The Utah legislature recently changed state law regarding fireworks. The changes make more types of fireworks legal for sale and use in the state, and open the window for legal use of fireworks from June 26 to July 26. (Bottle rockets and other fireworks that leave the ground after being ignited, as well as Roman candles, firecrackers, M-80's, cherry bombs, single or reloadable mortars and ground salutes are still illegal under the revised law.)

The use of fireworks always carries some risk. Reports of injuries and property damage from fireworks are common. In fact, just in the last few weeks a fire believed to have been caused by fireworks forced the evacuation of over 200 homes in Moab. It's important that we enjoy fireworks safely and responsibly, to avoid holiday celebrations turning to tragedy for us or for our neighbors.

Just a few common-sense tips like these can make fireworks much more safe:

- * Only use fireworks with responsible adult supervision.
- * Purchase fireworks only from reputable, licensed sellers located in Utah.
- * Make sure you are educated about the fireworks at time of purchase by the fireworks dealer and follow all use directions carefully.
- * Never use fireworks in windy conditions.
- * Always ensure an adequate clearance from nearby structures and properties. Many fireworks require up to a 30 foot ground radius and 150 foot vertical clearance for safe use.
- * Keep a water source close to douse fireworks and in case of any problems.

2011 Municipal Election Opportunity

This is the year for Municipal Elections. Santa Clara will have 3 City Council seats open in this election. Each seat is for a 4-year term. The November Election will be held on Tuesday, November 8, 2011.

Please consider serving your community by running for office for one of these positions. Qualifications to hold a Municipal Office are:

- 1. Be a US Citizen at the time of filing**
- 2. Be a registered voter of the municipality**
- 3. Be a resident of the municipality or a resident of the recently annexed area for a period of 365 consecutive days immediately preceding the date of the election.**
(Utah Code 10-3-301; 20A-9-201; 20A-9-203)

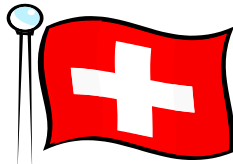

SHADE YOUR WAY TO SAVINGS

Santa Clara City and UAMPS (Utah Associated Municipal Power Systems) are partners in the Smart Energy Program, and remind us that leaving windows uncovered all day long in the hot summer months causes air conditioners to work harder than they have to. By shading south and west-facing windows with awnings, shutters or sunscreens you can reduce the amount of heat that comes through by up to 77%.

You can keep your view and cool off the house by choosing an outdoor window treatment that offers shade without completely covering the glass. Another consideration is to plant leafy trees near windows to filter the sun. Choosing a tree that sheds its leaves in the fall will allow the sun to shine through your windows in the cooler winter months when the sun's extra warmth will give your heating system a break.

FREE WATER CHECKS BY WASHINGTON COUNTY WATER CONSERVANCY DISTRICT

Free water checks are now available by the Washington County Water Conservancy District through September. Call 673-3617 to request an appointment. After your appointment you will be given a report on how to make your irrigation system more efficient, how long you need to water your lawn and how often you should water. This is great service to help us better conserve our precious water resources.

H.E.A.T. PROGRAM

The H.E.A.T. (Home Energy Assistance Target) Program is now accepting applications to assist eligible low-income households who need help paying their home heating bills. H.E.A.T. is a federally funded program that is administered by the State of Utah. The amount of payment is based on income, energy use, and at-risk groups in the household. Applications for the program will be taken once during the period between November 1, 2010—September 30, 2011 or until federal funds are exhausted. Each household can receive H.E.A.T. assistance once during this period. Residents who wish to apply for assistance may call to schedule an appointment at 435-652-9643. The H.E.A.T. office is located at 168 N. 100 E. Ste. 255, St. George, UT. 84770. Find applications and information at <http://www.housing.utah.gov/seal/heat>.
