Building Traditions—Theme for Swiss Days 2010

Santa Clara has long been known for its food traditions from Swiss egg noodles and chess pies to the delectable selections at Frei's Fruit Market. Many other traditions stem from the hard work ethic of the early pioneers or the inventive games played by children who capitalized on the free flowing water in the irrigation ditches and rudimentary toys to entertain themselves. Other traditions sprang up in the households, and many families honor and cherish them to this day.

Swiss Days, started nearly 20 years ago, has always intended to help keep these traditions alive. That seems to be a little harder as we have grown substantially. So this year, the Swiss Days organizers are hoping to recharge this phenomenon, and encourage everyone—whether you have grown up here or not—to experience Santa Clara traditions, to express some of your own, and to build new ones within your own families. June Clean Up Dumpsters

Clean up dumpsters have been scheduled for Saturday June 5, 2010. There will be 3 dumpsters at the Little League Parking Lot and 1 dumpster at the Town Hall Parking Lot. Please be reminded not to leave trash on the ground before dumpsters arrive or after they have been removed. These dumpsters are not for commercial or construction site clean up and not for disposal of paint, batteries, tires or large items such as furniture and appliances. Please call the Washington County Landfill at 674-7623 for information on how to dispose of hazardous materials, including paint, pesticides, or other chemical products. Allied Waste can be contacted at 628-2821 to schedule a special pick up of large or bulky items you need to dispose of. The St. George Reuse Center is located at 575 E. Brigham Rd.—they accept tree limbs, shrubs or other vegetation you may have removed and need to dispose of. They can be contacted at 634-5996.

STORM WATER WATCH

Because regulators and authorities cannot monitor all storm drains and water bodies at once, they rely on the public to keep them informed of water polluters. Community hotlines provide a means for concerned citizens and agencies to contact the appropriate authority when they see water quality problems.

To report spills, dumping emergencies, violations or suspicious activities please call (435)-673-6712, the main City phone number and after hours number. Generally an investigator will respond and in most cases visit the problem site.

Help Slow the Flow—Conserve Water

It is the time of year when we start to water our lawns and gardens more frequently and a good time to consider how each of us can do our part to conserve our precious water resources. We can all help by watching how long we water, the time of day we water, and to make sure we are watering our yards, not sidewalks, streets and driveways—lets all do our best to make sure our irrigation systems are adjusted correctly for our yards. Beginning May 15 the Washington Co. Water Conservancy District will offer a free residential water check program to help customize your irrigation system for your particular landscape. PARKS DEPARTMENT UPDATE

The preliminary design for the Gubler Park playground and family area has been completed by Sunrise Engineering. The new Park addition will include a large ADA accessible shaded playground area with age delineated play areas, 2 pavilions, trails, a multiuse playing court, and a large grass open space.

The Park addition will be constructed as money becomes available. New parks are funded through impact fees by new construction which is currently very slow. This means in order to build the park, we will need to obtain funding through grants and donations of labor and money. The Parks department will be working hard to obtain grants and other funding. GARAGE & YARD SALE REMINDER

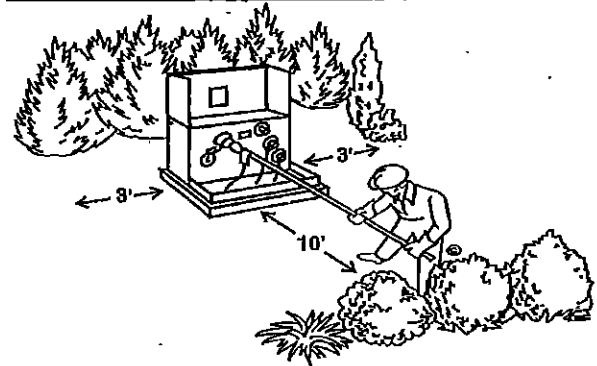

Just a friendly reminder to keep proper clearances around your utility boxes. Please keep all vegetation and any other obstructions 3 feet away from the sides and 10 feet away from the front of all electrical enclosures. Please do not allow dirt to build up around these enclosures so they do not rust or overheat. Transformers need air to flow around them to help keep them from overheating. Also keep the area around your electric meter clear and free from vegetation so the meter reader can do his job efficiently. Please call, go on-line, or fill out the "service request" form in this news letter to notify us of any problems or concerns you have regarding the cities electrical system. ONLINE UTILITY BILL PAYMENT

The City offers an online utility bill payment option through Xpress Bill Pay. Online bill pay is quick and easy to use and free to sign up and use. Go to www.xpressbillpay.com or to the City website at www.sccity.org and look for the online bill pay link. Once you are signed up you will receive an email to let you know when your bill is online, at which time you can go to the city website or the Xpress Bill Pay site to view your bill. When you are ready to pay your bill select a payment type; credit or debit card, or electronic funds transfer. You can also choose a specific day for your bill to be paid automatically each month. It's fast & easy!

H.E.A.T. PROGRAM

The H.E.A.T. (Home Energy Assistance Target) Program is accepting applications to assist eligible low-income households who need help paying their home heating bills. H.E.A.T. is a federally funded program that is administered by the State of Utah. The amount of payment is based on income, energy use, and at-risk groups in the household. H.E.A.T. applications for the year-round program will be taken once during the period of November 2, 2009—September 30, 2010 or until federal funds are exhausted. Each household can receive H.E.A.T. assistance **once** during this period. Residents who wish to apply for H.E.A.T. assistance may call 435-652-9643.

Please use the request form at the right to let our Public Service Department know if you have any service needs the City can take care of, such as street lights that may be out, sidewalks in need of repair, trees in power lines, or any other problems regarding streets, sidewalks, water or power issues.
