MAYOR'S NOTES SEPTEMBER 2010

The recent summer storms have brought the City some welcome relief from the heat and help to replenish our area water sources, but they also sometimes tend to arrive with a vengeance taxing the storm water collection system and in some cases damaging property. A big thank you to all those who mobilized to prevent additional damage from occurring during those events, from the City Public Works Staff to the friends and neighbors who stepped up to clean plugged inlets grates, ditches and pipes outside in the rain. Also thanks to the Public Safety Department and volunteer fire fighters for helping out with pumps and sandbags to minimize the damage.

It is a good reminder to all of us that we live in a desert and because it rains so infrequently that we do not pay attention to simple things that protect us from storm water runoff. There are currently 247 storm drain inlets, 51 outlets, 97 manholes, 324 different storm drain pipelines and many miles of gutters within the City, all of which require routine maintenance. During dry periods this system can be come plugged with nuisance items like grass clippings, leaves, and garbage due to non-use. During this last event I noticed one outlet was completely plugged with a basketball, toys and several pair of children's shoes. When we have a significant rain or hail event during summer months, trees can be stripped of green leaves which can plug storm drain inlets very quickly.

The City Public Works Department has 6 full time employees to maintain the storm drain system along with the streets, water and sewer systems and while they do a great job with limited resources, during large rainfall events, they can be overwhelmed. Large amounts of debris can accumulate very quickly and lead to potential problems. As residents we need to be vigilant and pay attention to potential problem areas. If you see a storm drain inlet plugged, notify the City Public Works Department or take a few minutes and clear the debris. Talk to your children about the importance of not putting items down storm drains or leaving items in the gutters. Keep area gutters and ditches clean and free from leaves and other debris. Let's all do our part to help the City keep the storm drain system working – remember it's for our protection. Thanks Santa Clara and stay safe.

SEPTEMBER CLEAN UP DUMPSTERS

Clean up dumpsters are scheduled for Saturday September 4, 2010. There will be 3 dumpsters at the Little League Parking Lot and 1 dumpster at the Town Hall Parking Lot. Please do not leave trash on the ground before the dumpsters arrive or after they have been removed. The dumpsters are to aid residential clean up and not for commercial or construction site waste. Also the county does not allow for disposal of paint, batteries, hazardous chemicals, tires or large items in these dumpsters. For pick up of large items like furniture and appliances please call Allied Waste to schedule a special bulky item pick up—their phone number is 628-2821. Contact the Washington County Landfill at 674-7623 to advise you on disposal of hazardous materials including paint, pesticides, and other chemical products; or visit the Washington County Solid Waste website for information regarding the disposal of these items and other waste—their website is wcsv.org. and is very informative and helpful. The St. George Reuse Center at 575 E. Brigham Rd. will accept tree limbs or other vegetation you have removed from your yard and need to dispose of; they can be contacted at 634-5996. We hope the cleanup dumpsters and other information provided will aid you in your clean up projects as we all strive to keep Santa Clara a clean and beautiful place to live.

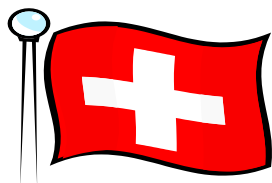

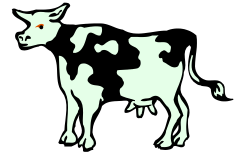

LOCAL BUSINESSES OPEN***SHUTTLES AVAILABLE

We would like to remind residents that Santa Clara Drive businesses will be open during Swiss Days. Santa Clara Drive will be closed for several hours early Saturday morning for the 5K race and the parade, but once the parade is over Santa Clara Drive will be open for travel and access to our local downtown businesses—from Krumpet's on the east side to Garden Sprout on the west side of town. Traffic will be a little slower due to the event, but this is a great time to stroll Santa Drive and visit our great local businesses as well as to take in the fun of Swiss Days. Also, a good time to use the shuttles that will be running all day Saturday to help get visitors from parking lots as far out as Snow Canyon High School, near State Bank and on the corner of Lava Flow Dr. The shuttles will have drop off/pick up stops at Canyon View Park—for the Red Rocks Car Show, Town Hall—for Swiss Days events, throughout the downtown district—to visit the historic district and shop local businesses, Town Square on the east—for shopping east side businesses and back to parking lots.
